*From the Vicarage, January 2015*

*Dear Friends,*

I must begin my January Newsletter contribution by posting 'Thanks'. The Vicarage has been, almost literally, showered with cards, gifts and calls of Christmas Greeting and fellowship. It is a very humbling experience. What makes it all the more remarkable is that it coincided with the anniversary of Jill and me coming to the 2 parishes – December 11th 2013. One of the results of this wealth of outpouring from you was the, inevitable, consequence that we couldn't get to everything to which we were invited. (And I'm not including the central heating boiler going on the 'blink' half an hour before the Children's Christmas Party!!). Thank you all so much for everything. Please do not, for one moment, consider that there was slight intended when we were absent).

Our Christmas services were very well attended – particularly the Village Carol Service. The singing was a delight and good spirit seemed to abound. Please remember that if you should ever want/wish a particular hymn to be played for an anniversary, celebration, or whatever – just ask, and we will try to arrange to play **your** hymn on the Sunday that you want. There is also a request book at the back of the church for Prayer requests. (Or you could 'phone the Vicarage 905837 and ask me directly to include a prayer tribute for someone).

The Full Moon on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> January appears immediately the day before The Epiphany, when tradition says the Wise Men visited the child in the manger and His parents. The Epiphany is a festival that has been allowed to decline in recent times, yet it is a very significant in terms of what it tells us. Unlike when the writer was a child, the understanding now is that Jesus may have been as old as 2 years at the time of the visit. (The Festival of the Holy Innocents, when Herod ordered the death of the children under the age of 2, is generally taken to indicate that this is a possibility). The gifts brought by the Wise Men of Gold,

Frankincense and Myrrh are seen as symbolic gestures/references to the future of the child in the manger. Gold would be presented to a king; Frankincense was a priestly offering; and Myrrh was a symbol of suffering to come.

May the New Year bring you and yours every possible blessing and good fortune – Go Well, with all Best Wishes from Team Vicarage.
