Easyfundraising.co.uk: A few months ago Marion Tucker drew our attention to this site as a simple way of raising funds for the village without costing you a penny, and she set up an account for it in the name of 'Burpham Village Hall and Recreation Ground', which is the registered name of our charity. So far 4 people from the village have raised £29.61 between them, just by doing some shopping online. Most of the most common shopping sites (Amazon, John Lewis, M&S, Argos - over 2,700 retailers in fact) are accessible through the Easyfundraising website and they pay a small percentage of your 'spend' to our account.
