From the Vicarage, October 2017

Dear Friends,

At a recent study day spent with clergy colleagues, we were asked to reflect on a very simple question: *Who am I not?* An odd thing to ask perhaps – but on reflection a profound one and a liberating one if you choose to think about it in greater depth. Frequently our identities are defined by what we do for a living, where we live, who we socialise or relax with or what sort of entertainment we choose for ourselves. But that also leads us and others to develop expectations which place unwelcome pressures on us and can cause a great deal of stress. So we were prompted to imagine writing a job profile or CV which began with the words *I am not.....* So in this in-between time of the year, when summer has gone and winter is not quite upon us, why not stop and reflect on *who you are not?* The seminar group came up with some surprising responses. Perhaps you might too!

In both Burpham and Poling I have been discovering who some of you are and some of the wonderful things you get up to. Celebrating harvest has been a joy – we have given thanks for the harvest of food for our tables and fuel for our winter fires. But I have marvelled too at a different sort of harvest – the harvest of skills and gifts expressed in music and the arts which have been in evidence in our villages this autumn. St Mary's was filled to bursting in mid-September for a concert which gave a taste of the wonderful gift of music, when the Shipley Arts Festival held its final 2017 performance to help raise the final tranche of funds for our church tower repairs. Many people used their gifts to make this happen – and whether that was putting up a marquee, cleaning the church and churchyard,

organising the sale of tickets and the provision of food and wine or the skills of the musicians themselves – all these are gifts from God put to good use for the benefit of all.



May I thank everyone for their outstanding generosity supporting this event, from all at The George for ‘feeding the 5,000’ – (well, 51 really), the Sponsors who enabled the event to go ahead and all who

supported by attending and helping. Between you, you raised about £3,500 – so we have crossed the line to pay for the Tower works while having some fun as well. Within a couple of weeks, the same efforts went into putting on a wonderful harvest supper in the village hall.

At St Nicholas, Poling a harvest of gifts called ‘Art in the Aisles’, an exhibition running from 30th September to 8th October showcasing the arts and crafts of many local artists also gives a flavour of a variety of gifts we have been blessed with. Truly a harvest of the gifts we have been given ‘*that we might have life in abundance*’ (John 10.v10).

I shall look forward to meeting more of you over the coming weeks and months and discovering more of those gifts which I am sure we have in abundance in our communities. And reflecting on ‘*who we are not*’ might help us discover our own gifts and skills as so many in our community have demonstrated in the harvest we have enjoyed in our churches this year.

Finally, a diary note for November; our annual Service of Remembrance will take place in the church on Sunday 12th November.
